Examination-in-chief by SPP Raja Thakare for the Statement

1. I am attached to KEM Hospital as medical officer since March 2005. Dr. Devkumar Naik, Dr. Prakash Kore, Dr. Rajesh Turekar, Dr. Shivshankar Akuskar, Dr. Amol Deshmukh were the other medical officers working with me in 2006. I am conversant with their handwriting. It is a municipal hospital. We have a common format of OPD case paper for all municipal hospitals in Mumbai.
2. When a person is brought by police for medical examination, first we ask the police to stay away from the patient. We ask the patient his name and age. We then ask him whether there are any medical complaints or any assault by any person or police. We then

do the general examination and then systemic examination. If a patient is conscious then we take the history from him and if he is unconscious then we take it from the person accompanying him. There is a protocol of writing the findings, but it may vary from doctor to doctor. The findings are written in the casualty book. The OPD casualty paper is kept below the page of the casualty book with a carbon paper. The entries in the casualty book are made in the ordinary course of work of the hospital. They are made by the medical officers who examine the patients. I have brought the original casualty books of the relevant period from the hospital.

3. (Learned SPP asks the witness to go through the casualty books and state about the entries). The entry at sr. no. 16884 shows that the patient by name Kamal Ahmed Vakil Ansari was brought on 22/07/06 by PC-32085 of the ATS at around 5.00 p.m. He himself gave the history. He was brought for routine medical checkup. He had no complaints. His vitals were stable and there was no external injury seen. The patient was medically fit at that time. Dr. Shivshankar Akuskar had examined him. The contents of the attested true photocopy of the entry are as per the contents of the entry in the

original register. (It is marked as **Ext.2116**). The contents of the OPD case paper are as per the contents of the original entry. (It is marked as **Ext. 2117**).

4. The entry behind the OPD case paper shows that the same patient was brought on 24/07/06 by PC-20543 of the ATS at around 6.30 p.m. for routine medical checkup. He himself gave the history. He had no complaints. The patient was stable and medically fit. There was no external injury seen. Dr. Shivshankar Akuskar had examined him.

5. The entry at sr. no.17407 shows that the same patient was brought on 28/07/06 by PC-1658 of the ATS at around 8.07 p.m. He himself gave the history. He was brought for routine medical checkup. He had no complaints. His vitals were stable and there was no external injury seen. The patient was medically fit at that time. The contents of the attested true photocopy of the entry are as per the contents of the entry in the original register. (It is marked as **Ext.2118**). The contents of the OPD case paper are as per the contents of the original entry. (It is marked as **Ext. 2119**).

6. The entry behind the OPD case paper shows that the same

patient was brought on 30/07/06 by PC-26522 of the ATS for routine medical checkup. He himself gave the history. He had no complaints. The patient was stable and medically fit. There was no external injury seen. Dr. Shivshankar Akuskar had examined him.

7. The entry behind the OPD case paper shows that the same patient was brought on 01/08/06 by PC-050581 of the ATS at around 3.15 p.m. for routine medical checkup. He himself gave the history. He had no complaints. His vitals were stable, there was no external injury seen and he was clinically fit.
8. The entry on the continuous OPD case paper shows that the same patient was brought on 03/08/06 by PC-26522 of the ATS for routine medical checkup. He himself gave the history. He had no complaints. His vitals were stable, there was no external injury seen and he was clinically fit. Dr. Shivshankar Akuskar had examined him.
9. The entry at sr. no.17960 shows that the same patient was brought on 04/08/06 by PC-20639 of the ATS at around 5.00 p.m. He himself gave the history. He complained of giddiness. His blood pressure was 90/60 mm/hg. Patient was referred to medical expert for examination. The contents of the attested true photocopy of the

entry are as per the contents of the entry in the original register. (It is marked as **Ext.2120**). The contents of the OPD case paper are as per the contents of the original entry. (It is marked as **Ext. 2121**). He was examined by Dr. Ranjit Kamble. The contents of the OPD case paper show examination finding by the EMS (Emergency Medical Service) Registrar. The history was given by the patient. Patient complained of giddiness since last two days and left ear pain with decreased hearing from left ear. There was no other complaint. Patient was non-hypertensive, non-diabetic and non-addict. No complaint of chest pain, dyspnea. No history of fever and seizures. On examination : general condition was fair, afebrile, no pallor, no icterus, no clubbing, blood pressure was 110/60. He was conscious, well oriented and his systemic examination was normal. He was referred to ENT for opinion. He was examined by ENT Registrar, gave same complaints of earache and giddiness with tinnitus. On examination there was no abnormality. He was given tablet Vertin. His ECG was normal.

10. The entry on the continuous sheet of the OPD case paper shows that the same patient was brought on 06/08/06 by PC-

5041 of the ATS for routine medical checkup. He himself gave the history. He had no complaints. His vitals were stable, there was no external injury seen and he was clinically fit. Dr. Shivshankar Akuskar had examined him.

11. The entry behind the case paper of Cooper Hospital is of our hospital. The same patient was brought on 09/08/06 for routine medical checkup. He himself gave the history. He had no complaints. His vitals were stable, there was no external injury seen and he was clinically fit. Dr. Ranjit had examined him. The contents of the OPD case paper are correct. (It is marked as **Ext. 2122**).

12. The entry at sr. no.18501 shows that the same patient was brought on 11/08/06 by HC-21252 of the ATS at around 9.15 p.m. He himself gave the history. He had no complaints. His vitals were stable, there was no external injury seen and he was clinically fit. The contents of the attested true photocopy of the entry are as per the contents of the entry in the original register. (It is marked as **Ext.2123**). The contents of the OPD case paper are as per the contents of the original entry. (It is marked as **Ext. 2124**). Dr. Rahul Patil had examined him.

- 13.** The entry behind the OPD case paper shows that the same patient was brought on 13/08/06 by PC-20543 of the ATS for routine medical checkup. He himself gave the history. He had no complaints. His vitals were stable, there was no external injury seen and he was clinically fit. Dr. Ranjit Kamble had examined him.
- 14.** The next entry behind the OPD case paper shows that the same patient was brought on 14/08/06 by HC-18982 of the ATS for routine medical checkup. He himself gave the history. He had no complaints. His vitals were stable, there was no external injury seen and he was clinically fit.
- 15.** The entry behind the OPD case paper Ext.2121 shows that the same patient was brought on 15/08/06 for routine medical checkup. He himself gave the history. He complained of earache and giddiness. He was examined by ENT specialist. The ENT specialist found complaint of hearing left side since 10-12 days, history of bud usage, no other ENT complaints, bilateral TM intact and right ear minor abrasions. He was prescribed certain tablets.
- 16.** The entry at sr. no. 19165 shows that the same patient was brought on 17/08/06 by PN-23358 of the ATS. He himself gave

the history. He had no complaints. His vitals were stable, there was no external injury seen and he was clinically fit. The contents of the attested true photocopy of the entry are as per the contents of the entry in the original register. (It is marked as **Ext.2125**). The contents of the OPD case paper are as per the contents of the original entry. (It is marked as **Ext. 2126**). Dr. Prakash Kore had examined him.

17. The entry at sr. no. 19124 shows that the same patient was brought on 19/08/06 by PC-03506 of the ATS at 11.50 a.m. He himself gave the history. He had no complaints. His vitals were stable, there was no external injury seen and he was clinically fit. He was brought for blood stain for record. He was referred to EMS for blood collection. The contents of the attested true photocopy of the entry are as per the contents of the entry in the original register. (It is marked as **Ext.2127**). The contents of the OPD case paper are as per the contents of the original entry. (It is marked as **Ext. 2128**).

18. The next entry behind the OPD case paper shows that the same patient was brought on 21/08/06 at around 12.40 p.m. for routine medical checkup. He himself gave the history. He had no complaints. His vitals were stable, systemic examination -NAD, there

was no external injury seen and he was clinically fit. Thereafter, he was brought on 23/08/06 at 11.35 a.m. for routine medical checkup. He himself gave the history. He had no complaints. His vitals were stable, systemic examination -NAD, there was no external injury seen and he was clinically fit. I had examined him on both days and the entries are in my handwriting.

19. The entry at sr. no. 19877 shows that the same patient was brought on 25/08/06 by HC-1793 of the ATS at 12.07 p.m. He himself gave the history. He had no complaints. His vitals were stable, there was no external injury seen and he was clinically fit. The contents of the attested true photocopy of the entry are as per the contents of the entry in the original register. (It is marked as **Ext.2129**). The contents of the OPD case paper are as per the contents of the original entry. (It is marked as **Ext. 2130**). Dr. Dhiraj Dongre had examined him.

20. The next entry behind the OPD case paper shows that the same patient was brought on 27/08/06 by PC-24459 for routine medical checkup. He himself gave the history. He had no complaints. His vitals were stable, systemic examination -NAD, there was no

external injury seen and he was clinically fit.

21. The entry at sr. no. 20159 shows that the same patient was brought on 28/08/06 by PC-22233 of the ATS at 11.45 a.m. He himself gave the history. He had no complaints. His vitals were stable, there was no external injury seen and he was clinically fit. The contents of the attested true photocopy of the entry are as per the contents of the entry in the original register. (It is marked as **Ext.2131**). The contents of the OPD case paper are as per the contents of the original entry. (It is marked as **Ext. 2132**). Dr. Dhiraj Dongre had examined him.

22. The next entry behind the OPD case paper Ext. 2130 shows that the same patient was brought on 29/08/06 by HC-21252 at 12.40 p.m. for routine medical checkup. He himself gave the history. He had no complaints. His vitals were stable, systemic examination -NAD, there was no external injury seen and he was clinically fit. Dr. Dhiraj Dongre had examined him.

23. The entry in the continuation sheet of Ext. 2132 shows that the same patient was brought on 31/08/06 at 11.35 a.m. He himself gave the history. He had no complaints. His vitals were

stable, there was no external injury seen and he was clinically fit. I had examined him.

His vitals were stable, there was no external injury seen and he was clinically fit. The contents of the attested true photocopy of the entry are as per the contents of the entry in the original register. (It is marked as **Ext.2142**). The contents of the OPD case paper are as per the contents of the original entry. (It is marked as **Ext. 2143**). Dr. Dhiraj Dongre had examined him.

26. The next entry behind the OPD case paper Ext. 2143 shows that the same patient was brought on 11/9/06 by PC for routine medical checkup. He himself gave the history. He had no complaints. His vitals were stable, systemic examination -NAD, there was no external injury seen and he was clinically fit. I had examined him and the entry is in my handwriting.

27. The entry at sr. no. 21515 shows that the same patient was brought on 13/9/06 by PC-32846 of the ATS at 9.45 a.m. He himself gave the history. He had no complaints. His vitals were stable, there was no external injury seen and he was clinically fit. The contents of the attested true photocopy of the entry are as per the contents of the entry in the original register. (It is marked as **Ext.2144**). The contents of the OPD case paper are as per the contents of the original entry. (It is marked as **Ext. 2145**). Dr. Devkumar Naik had examined him.

He had no complaints. His vitals were stable, systemic examination - NAD, there was no external injury seen and he was clinically fit. The next entry below it shows that the same patient was brought on 20/9/06 by PC for routine medical checkup. He himself gave the history. He had no complaints. His vitals were stable, systemic examination -NAD, there was no external injury seen and he was clinically fit. Dr. Shivshankar Akuskar had examined him.

30. The entry at sr. no. 22551 shows that the same patient was brought on 21/9/06 by PC-21504 of the ATS at 6.15 p.m. He himself gave the history. He complained of pain in right iliac fossa and gave history of vomiting. His vitals were normal, there was no external injury seen. He was given injection Cyclopam and was referred to ESR (Emergency Surgery Registrar). The contents of the attested true photocopy of the entry are as per the contents of the entry in the original register. (It is marked as **Ext.2148**). The contents of the OPD case paper are as per the contents of the original entry. (It is marked as **Ext. 2149**). Dr. Shivshankar Akuskar had examined him. The findings of the ESR under Dr. Abhay Dalvi were complaint of pain in back radiating to right flank and groin since three days, no history of vomiting, bowel/bladder complaints, nausea, similar complaints in past. On examination, general condition fair, vitals normal, per abdomen - soft, no tenderness, guarding or rigidity. The impression was renal colic. He was advised i/v Spasmo, 1 amp stat, USG Kidney Urine Bladder. The finding after the USG was that no abnormality was detected and the patient had symptomatic relief. He was advised tablet Spasmo and Rantac for 7 days.

31. The entry at sr. no. 22620 shows that the same patient was brought on 23/9/06 by PC-32085 of the ATS at 10.15 a.m. Patient was not willing to tell complaints, but patient is moaning. His pulse was 76 per minute, respiratory rate was 22 per minute, he was afebrile. He was referred to EMS. The contents of the attested true photocopy of the entry are as per the contents of the entry in the original register. (It is marked as **Ext.2150**). The contents of the OPD case paper are as per the contents of the original entry. (It is marked as **Ext. 2151**). Dr. Dhiraj Dongre had examined him. The findings of **the EMR were brought in view of ----- sounds making through mouth**, when asked to patient no any symptoms after asking deeply. History of pain at groin, pricking pain at inguinal region, sonography done to rule out renal colic – normal. History of vomiting twice yesterday, no history of fever/dyspnoea. On examination, pulse 80 per minute, blood pressure 125/80, respiratory system – clear, CVS – NAD, per abdomen - soft, tenderness at inguinal region. Respiratory rate - 20 per minute, no pallor, iterus, cynosis, clubbing and lymph adenopathy. He was advised injection Diclofenac 2 CC intra muscular stat. He was referred to ESR in view of pain at inguinal region. The

ESR had referred him for x-ray chest PA and abdomen standing. The findings after seeing the x-rays were within normal limits. The findings of the ESR on the continuation sheet at 11.00 a.m. are that the patient was brought by PC, history self, same complaints as made to EMS. On examination, general condition moderate, afebrile, vitals normal, per abdomen soft, no tenderness, guarding or rigidity. He was advised injections Spasoproxyvon 1 intra muscular stat and continue capsule Spasoproxyvon and tablet Rantac.

- 32.** The next entry behind the OPD case paper Ext.2145 shows that the same patient was brought on 25/9/06 by PC – 5041 of the ATS for routine medical checkup. He himself gave the history. He had no complaints. His vitals were stable, there was no external injury seen and he was clinically fit. Dr. Amit Sharma had examined him. The next entry in the continuation sheet of Ext.2151 shows that the same patient was brought on 27/9/06 by PC – 33419 of the ATS for routine medical checkup. He himself gave the history. He complained of pain in abdomen and right scrotal pain. He was referred to ESR for evaluation. Dr. Amit Sharma had examined him. The continuation sheet of the same day shows that at 12.10 p.m. he was seen by ESR

under Dr. Rajiv Satoskar. Patient gave history himself, brought by PC -1155 and is under custody of ATS, Bhoiwada. He complained of pain in abdomen, back and inguinal region right side from three days and history of vomiting, but no history of loose motion/constipation, fever, burning micturation. History of hematuria ten days back. On oral examination, his general condition was fair, afebrile, vitals normal, per abdomen – tenderness present, but no guarding or rigidity. No inguinal swelling. Patient was advised USG abdomen and scrotum and was referred for orthopedic opinion for back pain.

33. The USG report of the abdomen and pelvis in the yellow paper shows the finding medical renal disease, minimum ascites. The USG scrotum shows right spermatic cord hematoma.

34. The orthopedic surgeon examined the person at 1.45 p.m. The patient complained of back pain since five days, gave a history injury to back five days back, but no radiculopathy. On examination he found tenderness present in lumbar region and

paraspinal region, sensory/motor deficit-negative. He was advised ice gel local application, tablets movon, MR. He referred the patient back to ESR for lower abdomen/inguinal pain. On the back side of the findings, there are findings by the lecturer on call, who advised conservative management, scrotal support, tablets Inflamar and Phlogenzyme.

35. As per the entry behind the third page of Ext. 2151, the same patient was brought for examination on 29/09/06 by PC-33419 of the ATS, Bhoiwada for normal checkup. Behind it are the entries of 06th and 08/10/06. on 06/10/06 he was brought by PC-27844 of the ATS. On both days he had no complaints, he was stable, vitals were normal and he was clinically fit.

36. The entry at sr. no.17060 shows that patient by name

Tanveer Ahmed Mohd. Ibrahim Ansari was brought on 24/07/06 by HC-20543 of the ATS at 0045 a.m. He had no complaint, on examination his vitals were found to be stable, his systemic examination was within normal limits and there was no evidence of physical or mental illness. His identification mark, i.e., scar on left side of forehead 1 x 2 cm was noted. The contents of the attested true photocopy of the entry are as per the contents of the entry in the original register. (It is marked as **Ext.2152**). The contents of the OPD case paper are as per the contents of the original entry. (It is marked as **Ext. 2153**). Dr. Dhiraj Dongre had examined him.

external injury, BP-120/80, he was given medicines. The contents of the attested true photocopy of the entry are as per the contents of the entry in the original register. (It is marked as **Ext.2311**). The contents of the OPD case paper are as per the contents of the original entry. (It is marked as **Ext. 2312**). Dr. Shivshankar Akuskar had examined him. Behind the case paper are the entries dated 5th, 7th and 09/08/06. He was brought by PC-21252, 20543 and 18888 respectively on those days, he had no complaints, was conscious, vitals stable and clinically fit. Dr. Amit Sharma had examined him on 07/08/06.

121. The entry at sr. no. 18475 shows that the same patient was brought on 11/08/06 by HC-21252 of the ATS for routine checkup. He had no complaints. Vitals stable, S/E-NAD, no external injury and medically fit. The contents of the attested true photocopy of the entry are as per the contents of the entry in the original register. (It is marked as **Ext.2313**). The contents of the OPD case paper are as per the contents of the original entry. (It is marked as **Ext. 2314**). He was examined by Dr. Amol Deshmukh. Behind the case paper is the entry dated 15/08/06 when he was brought by HC-21252 of the ATS for routine checkup. He had no complaints. Vitals normal, S/E-

NAD, no external injury.

122. The entry at sr. no. 19217 shows that the same patient was brought on 17/08/06 by PC-21252 of the ATS, Kalachowki at 5.07 p.m. for routine checkup. He had no complaints. Vitals normal, S/E-NAD, no external injury and medically fit. The contents of the attested true photocopy of the entry are as per the contents of the entry in the original register. (It is marked as **Ext.2315**). The contents of the OPD case paper are as per the contents of the original entry. (It is marked as **Ext. 2316**). He was examined by Dr. Amol Deshmukh. Behind the case paper is the entry dated 19/08/06 when he was brought by PC-03509 of the ATS at 11.30 a.m. for blood staining for record. He had no complaints, was conscious, vitals stable, clinically fit. Referred to EMS for blood collection and ENT for buccal swab.

123. The entry at sr. no. 19298 shows that the same patient was brought on 21/08/06 by PC-25159 of the ATS at 11.00 a.m. for routine checkup. He had no complaints. On examination : GC fair, vitals normal, S/E-NAD. The contents of the attested true photocopy of the entry are as per the contents of the entry in the original register. (It is marked as **Ext.2317**). The contents of the OPD case paper are

as per the contents of the original entry. (It is marked as **Ext. 2318**).

Behind the case paper is the entry dated 23/08/06 when he was brought at 11.45 a.m. for routine checkup. He had no complaints. On examination : GC fair, afebrile, vitals stable, S/E-NAD. I had examined him on both days and the findings are in my handwriting.

124. The entry at sr. no. 19879 shows that the same patient was brought on 25/08/06 by PC-1793 of the ATS at 12.10 p.m. for routine checkup. He had no complaints. On examination : vitals stable, Syst-WNL, no evidence of physical or mental illness. The contents of the attested true photocopy of the entry are as per the contents of the entry in the original register. (It is marked as **Ext.2319**). The contents of the OPD case paper are as per the contents of the original entry. (It is marked as **Ext. 2320**). Dr. Dhiraj Dongre had examined him. Behind the case paper are the entries dated 27th and 29/08/06. He was brought by PC-22459 and 21412, no complaints, vitals stable, Syst-WNL, no evidence of physical or mental illness and medically fit. Dr. Dhiraj Dongre had examined him on 29/08/06. On the continuation sheet is the entry dated 31/08/06 when he was brought at 11.20 a.m. He had no complaints. On

examination : GC fair, afebrile, vitals stable, S/E-NAD. I had examined him and the findings are in my handwriting.

125. The entry at sr. no. 20745 shows that the same patient was brought on 02/09/06 by PC-32085 of the ATS at 11.50 a.m. for routine checkup. He complained of erythematous lesion on lower lip. He was referred to ward no. 17. The contents of the attested true photocopy of the entry are as per the contents of the entry in the original register. (It is marked as **Ext.2321**). The contents of the OPD case paper are as per the contents of the original entry. (It is marked as **Ext. 2322**). Dr. Dhiraj Dongre had examined him. Behind the case paper are the finds of the skin specialist. The patient complained to him of fluid filled lesions over lower lip since two days, history of fever three days back, history of similar complaint following fever every year 3-4 times per year. On examination: multiple vecicle grouped over erythematous base present over right side of lower lip. No oral erosion, impression herpes labialis. He was given medicine. On the continuation sheets below the entry dated 31/07/06 are the entry dated 4th, 6th, 8th, 11th, 13th, 15th, 16th and 19/09/06. He was brought by constables of the ATS. He had no complaints, GC fair, vitals

normal, S/E-NAD, no external injury. I had examined him on 6th and 16/09/06 and the findings are in my handwriting. Dr. Amol Deshmukh had examined him on 4th, 8th and 11/09/06. Dr. Shivshankar Akuskar had examined him on 13/09/06. Dr. Amit Sharma had examined him on 19/09/06.

126. The entry at sr. no. 22559 shows that the same patient was brought on 21/09/06 by PC-20543 of the ATS for routine checkup. He had no complaints. He was stable, vitals normal and was fit. The contents of the attested true photocopy of the entry are as per the contents of the entry in the original register. (It is marked as **Ext.2323**). The contents of the OPD case paper are as per the contents of the original entry. (It is marked as **Ext. 2324**). Dr. Shivshankar Akuskar had examined him. Behind the case paper is the entry dated 22/09/06 when he was brought by PC-31504 at 1.35 p.m. He complained of loose motion/vomiting, referred to EMR. I had examined him and the findings are in my handwriting. The findings of the EMR are complained of vomiting today, two episodes, loose motions watery with mucous, ten episodes today, no history of fever/oliguria/giddiness, abdomen pain- colicky, but not now, PR-90,

BP 100/70, other findings- normal. He was given medicines.

127. The entry at sr. no. 22867 shows that the same patient was brought on 26/09/06 by PC-32116 of the ATS for routine checkup. He had no complaints, vitals stable, syst-WNL, no evidence of physical or mental illness. The contents of the attested true photocopy of the entry are as per the contents of the entry in the original register. (It is marked as **Ext.2325**). The contents of the OPD case paper are as per the contents of the original entry. (It is marked as **Ext. 2326**). Dr. Dhiraj Dongre had examined him. Behind the case paper are the entries dated 30/09/06 and 02/10/06. He was brought by PC-18982 on 30/09/06. On both days no complaints, GC fair, patient conscious, vitals stable and clinically fit. The entry dated 08/10/06 is on the continuation sheet, he had no complaints, GC fair, stable, vitals normal and fit at present.

128. The entry at sr. no. 24140 shows that the same patient was brought on 09/10/06 by PC-27842 of the ATS at 1.30 p.m. for routine checkup. He had no complaints. On examination : GC fair, afebrile, vitals stable, S/E-NAD. The contents of the attested true photocopy of the entry are as per the contents of the entry in the

original register. (It is marked as **Ext.2327**). I had examined him and the findings are in my handwriting.

129. The entry at sr. no.21597 shows that the same patient was brought on 13/09/06 by PC-32116 of the ATS for routine checkup. He had no complaints, GC fair, vitals stable, syst-NAD and patient clinically fit. The contents of the attested true photocopy of the entry are as per the contents of the entry in the original register. (It is marked as **Ext.2328**).

130. The entry at sr. no.23206 shows that the patient by name Naveed Hussain Khan was brought on 30/09/06 by PC-5041 of the ATS at 12.20 p.m. for routine checkup. He had no complaints, conscious, vitals stable, syst-NAD and patient clinically fit. The contents of the attested true photocopy of the entry are as per the contents of the entry in the original register. (It is marked as **Ext.2329**). The contents of the OPD case paper are as per the contents of the original entry. (It is marked as **Ext. 2330**). Behind the case paper are the entries dated 02/10/06 and 04/10/06. He was brought by PC-33419 on 04/10/06. He had no complaints on both days, conscious, vitals stable, no injuries, syst-NAD and he was

clinically fit. Dr. Shivshankar Akuskar had examined him on 02/10/06.

131. The entry at sr. no. 23845 shows that the same patient was brought on 06/10/06 by PC-28022 of the ATS at 7.20 p.m. for routine checkup. He had no complaints. On examination: conscious, oriented, vitals stable. The contents of the attested true photocopy of the entry are as per the contents of the entry in the original register. (It is marked as **Ext.2331**). The contents of the OPD case paper are as per the contents of the original entry. (It is marked as **Ext. 2332**). Behind the case paper are the entries dated 08/10/06 and 10/10/06. He was brought for routine checkup, no complaints, GC fair, afebrile, vitals stable, SE-NAD, no injuries and he was fit. Dr. Shivshankar Akuskar had examined him on 08/10/06 and I had examined him on 10/10/06 and the findings are in my handwriting.

132. The entry at sr. no. 24314 shows that the same patient was brought on 11/10/06 by PC-32846 of the ATS at 9.15 a.m. for investigation of narco analysis. He had no complaints, on examination: conscious, oriented, vitals stable. Referred to EMS and patients was clinically fit. The contents of the attested true photocopy of the entry are as per the contents of the entry in the original register.

(It is marked as **Ext.2333**). The contents of the OPD case paper are as per the contents of the original entry. (It is marked as **Ext. 2334**). Behind the OPD case paper are the findings of the Registrar EMS. Patient asymptomatic, on examination, pulse 90 / min/mg, BP 120/76 mg, RS-BSBE, CVS S1 S2, CNS, PA-NAD.

133. The entry at Sr. no. 24588 shows that the same patient was brought by HC-21252 of the ATS at 8.00 p.m. on 12/10/06 for routine checkup. He had no complaints, GC fair, stable, vitals normal, fit at present. The contents of the true photocopy of the entry are as per the contents of the entry in the original register. (It is marked as **Ext. 2335**). The contents of the OPD case paper are as per the contents of the entry in the original register. (It is marked as **Ext .2336**). Dr. shivshankar Akuskar had examined him.

134. The entry at Sr. no. 25447 shows that the same patient was brought by HC-2327 of the ATS at 8.25 p.m. on 21/10/06 for routine checkup. He had no complaints. On examination, vital stable, Syst-WNL, no evidence of physical or mental illness. The contents of the true photocopy of the entry are as per the contents of the entry in the original register. (It is marked as **Exh. 2337**). Dr. Dhiraj Dongre

had examined him. The entry behind the OPD case paper Ext. 2334 is of 26/10/06. He was brought by PN-25159 of the ATS for normal checkup. He had no complaints, vitals normal, S/E-NAD, no external injury.

135. The entry at sr. no. 23654 shows that the patient by name Asif Bashir khan was brought on 03/10/06 by PC-9464 of the ATS at 8.40 p.m. He had no complaints, on examination : vitals stable, Syst-WNL, no evidence of physical or mental illness. The contents of the true photocopy of the entry are as per the contents of the entry in the original register. (It is marked as **Exh. 2338**). The contents of the OPD case paper are as per the contents of the entry in the original register. (It is marked as **Ext.2339**). Dr. shivshankar Akuskar had examined him. Behind the case paper are the entries dated 10/10/06 and 13/10/06. He was brought by PC-27844 on 10/10/06 at 12.05 p.m. He had no complaints, On examination : GC fair, afebrile, vitals stable, S/E-NAD. I had examined him and the findings are in my handwriting. On 13/10/06 he complained of loose motion, GC was fai, pulse-80, BP 120/70, RS/CVS/CNS-NAD. He was given medicines.

136. The entry at sr. no.24702 shows that the same patient was brought on 14/10/06 by PN-25159 of the ATS at 8.25 a.m.and was referred to EMS for investigation as per the letter of the Sr. PI. The contents of the true photocopy of the entry are as per the contents of the entry in the original register. (It is marked as **Exh. 2340**). Dr. Dhiraj Dongre had examined him.

137. The entry at sr. no. 24774 shows that the same patient was brought on 16/10/06 by PC-27844 of the ATS at 12.20 p.m.for medical checkup. He had no complaints, was conscious, vitals stable and clinically fit. The contents of the true photocopy of the entry are as per the contents of the entry in the original register. (It is marked as **Exh. 2341**). The contents of the OPD case paper are as per the contents of the entry in the original register. (It is marked as **Ext. 2342**). Behind the case paper and on continuation sheet are the entries of 18th, 21st and 23/10/06. He was brought by Pc-6383 and HC- 18888 and PC-6383 respectively of the ATS at 12.05, 07.50 and 10.55 a.m. for medical checkup. I had examined him on 18th and 21/10/06. on 18/10/06 he had complained of itching for which he had prescribed medicines. On both days his GC fair, afebrile, vitals

stable, S/E-NAD. On 23/10/06 no complaints, conscious, vitals stable and clinically fit.

138. The entry at sr. no. 25843 shows that the same patient was brought on 26/10/06 by PN-14438 of the ATS at 11.00 a.m. for medical checkup. He had no complaints, no external injuries, was conscious, vitals stable and clinically fit. The contents of the true photocopy of the entry are as per the contents of the entry in the original register. (It is marked as **Exh. 2343**). The contents of the OPD case paper are as per the contents of the entry in the original register. (It is marked as **Ext. 2344**). Behind the OPD case paper is the entry dated 01/11/06. He was brought by Pc-33419 of the ATS at 11.15 a.m. for medical checkup. He had no complaints, conscious, vitals stable, S/E-NAD and clinically fit.

139. None of the patients examined by me and as per the record examined by the other doctors, had complained of ill treatment and torture at the hands of the police.

Cross-examination by adv Wahab Khan for A2, 7, 10 and 13

140. The other medical officers who had examined the patients are available. But, some are abroad. It is true that they did not examine the concerned patients in my presence and the entries were not made in my presence. It is true that the basic purpose for production of the accused for medical examination was to keep a check on police atrocities and torture. Torture can be mental as well as physical. Without any complaint from the patient mental torture cannot be observed by the medical officer. Marks of physical torture disappear because of passage of time. I am not aware whether there are methods for healing signs of physical torture as early as possible. I cannot say whether asking a person to do an exercise repeatedly or to stand in a particular position for long time will amount to torture. Electric shock is a method of torture. I am not aware about frequent methods of police torture. I am not aware whether police physical torture do not normally leave signs of injuries. It is not true that if a person has pains because of forcing him to adopt a particular posture for a long period of time and he is asked to run or bang his hands on hard surface then the pain will subside.

Q. All the patients that were produced before us had been physically and mentally tortured by the ATS?

A. As per the record there is no evidence of physical or mental torture. It is not true that the entire record produced was prepared by our hospital at the dictates of the ATS officers showing subsidies form of police torture. It is not true that whenever custody patients are produced for examination, it is necessary always to obtain their thumb impression or signature or their identification marks are required to be noted for our record. It is not mandatory to do so. It is true that on the basis of our record the patients cannot be identified now. It is not true that all the patients were not examined by removing all their clothes. It is not true that i and all the other doctors surrendered to the dictates of the ATS officers.

141. (Learned advocate asks the witness to go through Ext. 2232). The patient by name Sajid Margoob Ansari was examined on 29/09/06.(Learned advocate asks the witness to go through Ext. 2240). The same patient was examined on 23/10/06. As per record no old or fresh external injury was found. (Learned advocate asks the witness to go through Ext. 1744). From this document, it is seen

that the same patient was examined on 26/10/06 and had 11 injury marks. The age of the injuries mentioned is 5-6 days old. These are signs of trauma, but I cannot say whether they are signs of police torture. Medical officers like me should have noticed these injury marks. These marks were not there when he was examined by us on 23/10/06, therefore, they are not mentioned in the entry in the register and the case paper. I cannot say whether the medical officer who issued Ext. 1744 gave wrong age of the injuries. It is mentioned there in that the injuries were not within 24 hours.

Q. the injuries mentioned therein were present on his person on 21/10/06 and 23/10/06?

A. As per our record they were not present.

142. If a person is not given food, he can suffer from giddiness. The papers of the patient Sajid Ansari do not show his complaint of giddiness or fainting at anytime. (Learned advocate asks the witness to go through Exts. 1051 and 1052). It is true that they show that the patient had complained of giddiness and fainting on 24/10/06 and 25/10/06. We examine the body of the patient even if he does not complain. It is true that it is mentioned in Ext. 1744 that

the patient does not complain of having any injuries. (Learned advocate asks the witness to go through Ext. 2135). It is true that the jail authority had noticed injury marks on the person of the said patient. Coloure of injuries changes due to passage of time. On the basis of the colour of the injury, an expert can determine the approximate age of the injury. I cannot say whether the injury mentioned in it shows subcutaneous haemorrhage. The protocol for examining the custody patients is similar for all hospitals. The colour of the injuries changes day by day. It is true that as per the containts of Exh. 1744, the patient was examined on 25/10/06 and greenish to yellowish discolouration was noticed. i cannot say whether the injuries show brutal torture, but there was trauma.

143. Swelling on right foot with tenderness in both thighs can be a result of trauma or exercise. Medical officers like me can notice these things. If a wound is infected there can be fever with chill. One may suffer headache, if he is mentally tortured or not given the food. Capsule Doxycyclin is an antibiotic. Paracetamol is given for headache and fever. If a doctor wants to observe a patient, he may ask for followup. (Learned advocate asks the witness to go through

the Ext. 2079). It shows the observations of the doctor of 16/10/06. He had asked for follow up after three days. (Learned advocate asks the witness to go through the medical papers in respect of accused Mohd. Majid produced by him and to say whether he finds any finding consistent to the finding in Ext. 2079). There is no finding consistent with the findings in Ext. 2079. It is not true that deliberately false entries are made at the instance of the ATS officers showing no injury marks.

144. Heamatoma is accumulation of blood and is possible by trauma. If a person is kicked in the scrotum, he can sustain such type of injury. Spermatic cord heamatoma is possible by trauma. I cannot say whether it is because of police torture. A person can have pain in the ear, if he is slapped forcefully. Minor abrasion is possible if a person is assaulted by stick or hard object. There are rare chances of infection in ear because of minor abrasion. A medical officer can advise Amoxycillin antibiotic for infection. If a person complains of lesser form of pain, Voveran tablet can be given. If a person is unable to swallow tablet, dispersible tablet or syrup is advised. (Learned advocate asks the witness to go through the Ext. 2121). It is not true

that this was because of police torture, because it is mentioned that the patient gave the history of use of buds. It is not true that the said history was written at the dictates of the ATS officers. It is not true that the patient Kamal Ansari was having many injury marks on his person, but deliberately all the injury marks are not mentioned in the papers concerning him.

145. If a person is provided with contaminated food and water, he may suffer from vomiting and loose motions. It may be that in most of the entries that I produced, it is not mentioned that the patient gave history. I cannot say whether some of the patients were so brutally assaulted that they were unable to come to the hospital. It is not true that I and the other medical officers were under such pressure of the ATS officers that we used to visit the ATS office and certified the patients as fit. (Learned advocate asks the witness to go through Ext. 2310). I do not know the name of the doctor who visited Bhoiwada Police Station to examine the patient. (Learned advocate asks the witness to go through Ext. 2228). I do not know the name of the doctor who visited Bhoiwada Police Station to examine the patient. It is not necessary that only when there is

emergency, the doctors of the surgery department examine the patient.

146. (Learned advocate asks the witness to go through Ext.2251). I do not know the name of the doctor who visited Bhoiwada Police Station to examine the patient on 31/07/06. (Learned advocate asks the witness to go through Ext.2178). I do not know the name of the doctor who visited Bhoiwada Police Station to examine the patient. The same doctor had examined the patient. (Learned advocate asks the witness to go through the entry dated 03/10/06 behind Ext.2220). It is true that the word 'days' in front of 15 is canceled and the words 'years' is written and there are no initials thereon. This entry is not in the casualty register. The handwriting is of orthopedic registrar, whose name I do not know. X-ray reports that were advised are not on record. The findings of the x-rays are also not mentioned.

147. There can be pain in scapula if a man is hanged at a height by tying his hands by rope after taking care that there will be no marks of the rope on the hands. Pain in overhead abduction and tenderness present on left scapula on left side is also possible. (Learned advocate asks the witness to go through Ext.2220). There was no pain in other joints. The finding is that other joints are painless. I do not know whether the advise of immobilization, etc., was complied with by the police. It is not true that belt is always advised for immobilization.

148. If a person is not given food or if he has head injury, he will suffer from giddiness. It depends on the location of the internal injury and amount of blood loss for a person to have low BP. If there is a serious internal injury, the blood pressure of a person will be low. (Learned advocate asks the witness to go through Ext. 2229). It is true that the patient was having low blood pressure when he was examined. If a person is assaulted on legs, he may find difficulty in walking. (Learned advocate asks the witness to go through Ext.

2230). The patient gave the history that he had difficulty in walking. This patient was examined on 19/10/06 at 1.30 p.m. by the casualty officer, then by the EMS Registrar and then EMS Lecturer at 2.50 p.m. A person may sustain fracture of ribs if he is assaulted by fist blows on his ribs. There is no remark about who gave the history to the casualty officer, EMS Lecturer and Registrar. The patient by name Mohd. Ali gave history of pain in left scapular region on 03/10/06 for the first time. Thereafter he did not complain of pain in the scapular region. (Learned advocate asks the witness to go through Ext. 2227). On 14/10/06 the said patient was referred to EMS for investigation. There is a reference to a letter from the Sr. PI. The outward number of that letter is 1313 of Sr. PI/ATS/2006. I do not know whether this letter is not before the court. It is not written on the paper about the history given by the patient and what were the findings of the examination. OPD case paper of that day is not on record. The letter of the Sr. PI for examine the patient is the routine procedure. There is no such record that 14/10/06 there were brutal marks of injuries on his person. I do not know whether the ATS officers have deliberately suppressed the OPD case paper of that

date. It is not true that the patient had complained of brutal torture and there were marks of injuries on his person and deliberately they are not mentioned in the casualty register. It is not true that the entries are made at the dictates of the ATS officers.

149. It is not true that we were visiting the ATS office and lockups privately though on duty at the request of the ATS officers. We are not permitted to make private visits while on duty. We can go and visit a patient outside the hospital on receipt of official communication in some circumstances. I am not aware of the official communication and special circumstances when the medical officer had visited Bhoiwada lockup and who made the correspondence.

150. (Learned advocate asks the witness to go through the documents concerning A3, A9, A10 and A11). The patients by name Faisal, Muzzammil, Suhail and Zameer were examined at the Bhoiwada Police Station on 31/07/06. It is true that on 29/07/06 and 02/08/06 they were examined at the hospital. The timings are written on the basis of the time of examination or timing of recording of the observations. As per the record each of these four patients were examined within five minutes each on 31/07/06. (Learned advocate

asks the witness to go through Ext. 2286). The patient by name Suhail complained of atypical chest pain radiating towards left arm, but he was not brought for reassessment. (Learned advocate asks the witness to go through the continuation sheet ahead of Ext. 2326, i.e., in continuation of the entry dated 22/09/06, behind Ext. 2324). The red tick marks on the medicines prescribed show that the medicines were given. It is not true that it show that the prescription was canceled. The patient had complained of loose motions and vomiting on 22/09/06.

151. It is not true that all the patients whom we examined had complained of police torture. There is no such record, therefore, it is not true that all these patients were tortured in custody by the ATS police. It is not true that none of the patients was carefully examined by us. (Learned advocate asks the witness to go through Ext.2281). The patient had no complaints, even then he was referred to EMS to find out whether he was suffering from dehydration. It is not true that some other police constable had taken the patient to the EMS registrar. It is not true that there is overwriting on the date. There appears to be some overwriting in the time.

152. (Learned advocate asks the witness to go through the casualty register no. 39). Entries no. 19051, 19099, 19149, 19415, 19421, 19527, 19535, 19635, 19801, 19803 and 19871 are canceled as some of them are blank. In entries no. 19005, 19195, 19239, 19245, 19251, 19253, 19255, 19257, 19269, 19271, 19273, 19275, 19401, 19403, 19409, 19411 the time of examination of patient is not mentioned. Observations are not recorded in entries at sr. no. 19005 and 19133. It is possible that similar entries are there in all the registers that I brought to the court. It is possible that one or more patients are examined at the same time. Some of the patients are examined within a gap of 1-2 minutes. This is because two medical officers and two interns are sitting in the casualty. These patients were brought for examination prior to sending them for narco analysis tests.

153. (Learned advocate asks the witness to go through Ext.2254). The entry shows that the patient by name Muzzammil was brought at 9.50 p.m. and was examined by CMO at 9.15 p.m. This is a writing mistake.

154. If a patient makes a complaint or if it is necessary for

investigation, then he is referred to the EMS or medical opinion. Even if there is no complaint by the patient, but the medical officer finds marks of injury, then the patient is referred for surgical opinion. (Learned advocate asks the witness to go through entry no. 20723). The patient by name Ehtesham was asked to be referred back SOS to the EMR/medicine OPD. (Learned advocate requests that the entry be exhibited. The prosecution is directed to produce a true photocopy of the entry. It is marked as **Ext.2348**). The reference to EMS or EMR is a routine practice asking the patient to come back, if he has any complaints. I am following this practice. It is true that it is not so written by me in respect of any of the patients whom I examined in this case. I am aware of the protocol and I am governed by it. It is not true that it is necessary for a medical officer to write his name, date and time and to put his signature in every entry. It is true that none of the entries about which I deposed show the names of the medical officers. (Learned advocate asks the witness to go through entry no. 18480). It is true that the last sentence in this entry mentions refer back SOS. It is concerning the patient by name Ehtesham. (Learned advocate requests that the entry be exhibited. The prosecution is

directed to produce a true photocopy of the entry. It is marked as **Ext.2349**). One may sustain pain in thigh, if legs are stretched laterally. There may be tenderness, but not swelling. (Learned advocate asks the witness to go through entry no. 17958). It is concerning the patient by name Ehtesham and he had complained of pain in thigh. (Learned advocate requests that the entry be exhibited. The prosecution is directed to produce a true photocopy of the entry. It is marked as **Ext.2350**). The findings were that there was tenderness present in left thigh, but no obvious external injury. He was referred for orthopedic opinion. I do not know what were the findings of the orthopedic surgeon. I do not know whether that paper was removed as it was showing police torture.

155. If there is some medical trauma or illness, the investigation like CBC, x-ray chest are advised. There also advised for medical fitness purposes.

156. (Learned advocate asks the witness to go through Ext. 2340). The patient Asif Bashir Khan was also referred to EMS for investigation. The findings of the casualty medical officer are not mentioned. History is also not mentioned. Reason for referring him to

EMS for investigation is not mentioned. I can state about the investigation that was done on going through the EMS record. The findings of the EMS are not on record. I do not know whether that record is deliberately removed. It is not true that the patient had complained of police torture and there were visible marks of injuries on his person, therefore, the patient was referred to the EMS. I do not know the name of the EMS Registrar. Same is the case about the patient by name Mohd. Majid in the entry at Ext. 2218. He was referred to EMS without mentioning the findings of the observations by the CMO. EMS findings are not on record. I do not know whether those papers are deliberately removed to hide the findings about the police torture.

157. I am not aware whether court order was produced before the medical checkup for narco analysis was done. I do not know whether the written consent of the patients was obtained. I am not aware about the procedure and method of narco analysis.

158. Ethyl alcohol is a irritating substance and if it is taken in large quantity then it is stupefying. If a person is admistered ethyl alcohol in large quantity then there will be physiological

complications, such as diminished reflexes, slower heart rate, lower respiration and decreased body temperature. A person may die if the percentage of ethyl alcohol in his blood goes upto 0.50%. I cannot say without calculating it as to whether 9 mg in 100 ml blood can create more serious effect. It is not true that I gave evidence as instructed by the ATS officers.

Cross-examination by Adv P. L. Shetty for A3, 8, 9, 11

159. An OPD paper is required to be taken before a patient is examined. The OPD case paper is issued and the entries are made in the casualty register at the same time. OPD numbers are different from the casualty register entry numbers. The record of examination that remains with the hospital is the casualty book or MLC book. It is necessary to record the name and particulars of the patients and the findings of examination. I do not understand what is exactly meant by particulars of the patient. The name of the patient, his age, sex, religion and the place of residence are required to be mentioned in

the casualty book. It is true that these are the particulars of the patient. Previous OPD papers are required to be produced, if a patient is brought again. It is true that we go through the previous OPD paper and examine him again. We do not use the OPD paper of other hospitals. It is true that if a patient examined earlier in another municipal hospital is brought to us, we issue fresh OPD case paper, make entry in the book and then examine him.

160. (Learned advocate asks the witness to go through Ext. 2242). I cannot tell the name of the doctor who examined the patient by name Abdul Wahiddin on 29/09/06 and in whose handwriting the entry and the OPD case paper is. We can join the continuation sheets to the OPD case paper, if same patient is brought again. There is no such criteria as to when fresh OPD case paper is issued. (Learned advocate asks the witness to go through the findings dated 03/10/06 on the back side of Ext. 2242). He was examined at 12.45 a.m. on 03/10/06. Same time of examination is shown by the EMS Registrar. I cannot tell the name of the medical officer and the name of the EMS Registrar, who examined him on 03/10/06. It is true that the numbers of the PC who produced the accused before the two doctors are

different. There is no mention in the notings by the EMS Registrar about making any investigation. It is true that after his findings is the entry about examining the patient on 13/10/06. Dr. Shivshankar Akuskar examined him on that day. Above that entry is the endorsement of the CMO about referring the patient to the EMS for medical checkup. The necessity for making the said endorsement again was that the patient might have been reassessed after some time after giving medication. The timing of keeping the patient for some time there is not mentioned. There is no mention of any further investigation after the examination by the EMS. OPD case paper, Ext.2244 was issued on 05/10/06 and entry was made in the casualty book for the same patient. (Learned advocate asks the witness to go through Ext. 2244). It is true that first name of the patient is written as Menakshi, then it is struck off and the name of Wahiddin is written. The casualty number is shown as 23818. (Learned advocate asks the witness to go through entry no. 23818 in the casualty book). It is true that the name of the patient is mentioned as Kanta Daulat Kasabe, female patient. The handwriting in the OPD case paper in Ext. 2245 is of Dr. Dhiraj Dongre. The patient Kanta Daulat Kasabe

was also examined by him. The casualty number and the name of the patient is in his handwriting. Signature of the patient Wahiddin is not taken in the casualty register or on the OPD case paper. It is true that the name of the patient is not mentioned in the entries of his examination when he was examined on 7th and 09/10/06 behind Ext. 2245. No casualty numbers were given for these two entries. The number of the constable is not mentioned in the entry dated 09/10/06. The findings of 07/10/06 are in the handwriting of Dr. Amit Sharma and of 09/10/06 of Dr. Shivshankar Akuskar.

161. The x-ray of the same patient was taken as per the advise of the ESR dated 17/10/06 and it was NAD. I cannot tell at what time the endorsement of NAD was made. Tablet Cinzar was given to the said patient on 19/10/06 by the EMS Lecturer as per the endorsement behind the OPD case paper Ext. 2249. I cannot tell the names of the EMS Registrar and Lecturer, whose handwritings are behind the OPD case paper and on the continuation sheet. I do not know at what time he was allowed to go on 17th and 19/10/06. The report of random blood sugar (RBS) was awaited when the reports about x-ray chest and ECG were written by the EMS Lecturer. I had

examined the patient only on 21/10/06 as per the record that is here. It is on the back page on Ext. 2249. Ahead of this entry is the entry dated 26/10/06. I cannot explain why the entry dated 26/10/06 is made after the entry dated 21/10/06 and why it is followed by the entry dated 23rd and 25/10/06. The entry dated 25/10/06 is in the handwriting of Dr. Amol Deshmukh. I do not know the name of the Skin Registrar whose findings are on the backside. X-ray of abdomen was taken on 17/10/06. I cannot tell at what time it was taken. The date of x-ray is mentioned, but the time is not mentioned.

162. (Learned advocate asks the witness to go through Exts. 2329 and 2330). I cannot tell the name of the doctor who has made the entries in these documents. and the entry dated 04/10/06. I do know in whose handwriting are the entries Exts. 2333 and 2334 of 11/10/06. He was advised x-ray of chest on that day. The timing of taking the x-ray is not mentioned. The reason for advising x-ray is for medical fitness for narco analysis test. The report of the x-ray is not mentioned. I say that x-ray was taken because x-ray number is mentioned there. The x-ray request form is attached with that OPD case paper. (It is marked as **Ext. 2351** at the request of the learned

advocate). The column about the x-ray report and opinion of radiologist are blank. The table of the size of the x-ray is also blank. The table of the size of the x-ray plate and the columns of x-ray report of radiologist of the patient Wahiddin on the x-ray request form are also blank. (It is marked as **Ext. 2352** at the request of the learned advocate). The entry of 26/10/06 is below the entry of 11/10/06 on OPD case paper, Ext. 2334, of the patient by name Naveed. It is in the handwriting of Dr. Amol Deshmukh. OPD case paper of 21/10/06 is not on record.

163. (Learned advocate asks the witness to go through Ext. 2336). It is true that OPD number is not written in it. He was not referred for any medical investigation on that day. Urine routine and microscopic examination was advised on 11/10/06. The endorsement about it must be of that day. EMS is the name of the ward where the EMS registrars sit and the examination is done. I say on the basis of the previous papers that the investigations were ordered on 11/10/06. It is not true that the continuation sheet ahead of Ext. 2336 shows the date 12/10/06, it is 11/10/06. (The two continuation sheers are marked as **Exts. 2353 and 2354** at the request of the learned

advocate). It is not true that the figure at sr. no. 2 in the date is '2' and not '1'. It is not like that the said figure differs from the figure at sr. no.1. The figure 137058 in Ext.2353 may be the OPD registration number, but I have to confirm it. Same number is written in the OPD case paper Ext. 2334 of 11/10/06. OPD registration number is not mentioned in the entry dated 12/10/06, Ext. 2335.

164. We positively mention the findings of examination of the patient in the case paper. It is true that in Ext. 2337 the name of the patient was written as Sajid first and then it was struck off and the name Naveed was written. In all other entries of this patient his age is mentioned as 26 years. In Ext. 2337 it is mentioned as 27 years. The findings of examination are no evidence of physical or mental illness. Vitals are stable include the normal blood pressure, pulse rate, etc. (Learned advocate asks the witness to go through Ext. 2245). It is also in the handwriting of Dr. Dhiraj Dongre. It is not true that the last line means no complaint of mental or physical illness.
